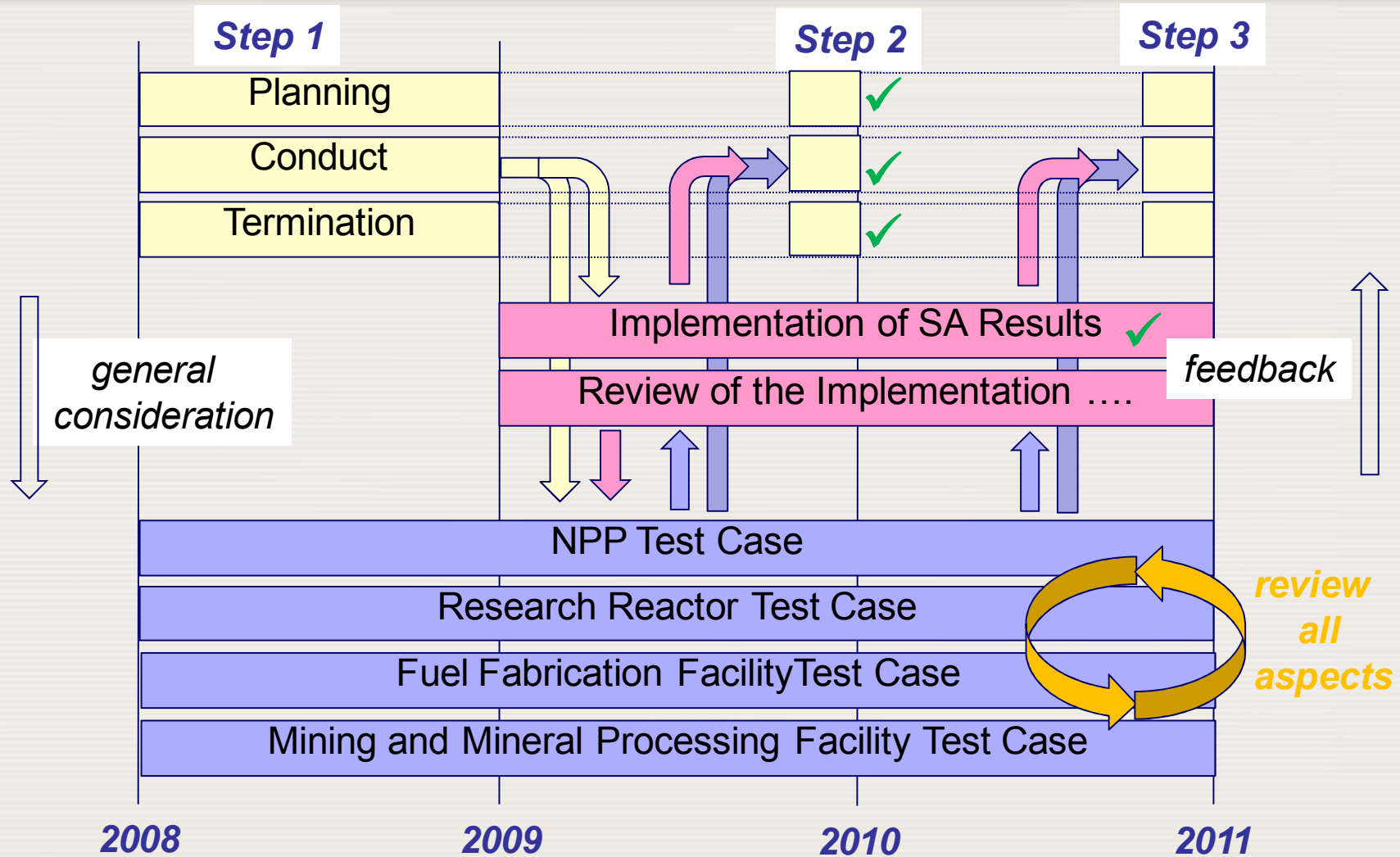

 - specific MM TC: “reflection” on DeSa and FaSa methodology in mining and milling sector
